
Topics for this workshop:

- Breeding Soundness Exam (BSE), what is the cost vs. the return for a thorough and accurate examination?

If you depend on your cows having a calf each year to help pay for your cattle enterprise, you should be interested in attending this workshop! We will visually evaluate and collect bulls during this workshop. The TAMU Vet School will assist with showing how a complete breeding soundness exam is performed. There will be equipment on hand to allow participants to view actual samples collected during the workshop under the microscope with detailed instruction on often overlooked issues.

Program speakers from Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, and Texas A&M Veterinary School, will discuss bull

management items of great importance to any cow/calf producer.

From LEAF-PRO to Dinner Tonight

The 2014 Walker County "Grown Fresh!" program series (6 meetings over 3 months) will showcase timely information on how to grow common home vegetable garden products with emphasis on proper environmental management and ultimate utilization of the produce in a nutritious addition to the family diet.

Selected vegetables which are suitable for production in Walker County will be discussed during the course of this educational effort. Featured vegetables will be discussed prior to optimum spring planting dates/time. This effort will allow program participants to plan for and work their gardens shortly prior to recommend planting time. Participants will learn how to produce and manage healthy, locally adapted food products which will encourage and support added selfsustainability options for their family. Production recommendations will utilize Texas A&M AgriLife Extension & Walker County LEAF-PRO information. Each featured vegetable product will include demonstration(s) on preservation, or fresh utilization in the daily family diet as appropriate. Nutritional information and utilization methods will be provided to program participants regarding the healthy benefits of the home produce based on the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, Dinner Tonight program.

# 2014 Turfgrass Ecology & Management Short Course

January 27-January 31 in College Station, TX

The Turfgrass Ecology and Management Short Course is an intensive 5-day educational opportunity for anyone interested in the fundamentals of turfgrass physiology and management. It is designed for professional turfgrass managers as well as anyone else in the green industry with a desire to learn the basics of how to properly manage turfgrasses with respect to growth, fertility, pest control, water use, water quality, etc. Attendees will be exposed to the fundamentals of proper turfgrass selection, growth and maintenance as

well as the latest up-to-date information from a diverse collection of Texas A&M University faculty.
